ASPC 2024 Annual Conference

10th & 11th May at Sedgebrook Hall, Northamptonshire, NN6 8BD

The Annual ASPC conference is just around the corner, only FOUR weeks away!!

What do you mean you haven't bought your ticket yet??

So, what have we for you this year on top of all the usual excellent networking, comradeship, and camaraderie with your likeminded peers whilst learning about new opportunities?

Friday join us for lectures on Therapeutic Circumcision by ASPC member Ruhul Amin; the anatomy of the hand from Pulvertaft Consultant Dan Armstrong; differentiating lumps and bumps using Ultrasound, from the chairman of POCUS GP Lee Pursglove; a day in the life of primary care skin surgeon with Miles Scholar; a beginner's guide to Non-Surgical Aesthetics with Yen Lam; and setting up private surgical services with Justin Kwong, chair of the PCSA.

Our keynote speaker is the world-renowned Professor Michel Labreque from Canada, a decade on since his last visit to us, with an update on his quest for the perfect vasectomy.

The day ends with a quiz, and a mystery prize for the winner!

Our Gala dinner on Friday night has become one of the must go to events of the year, with the ante being upped this year as we have a visiting close-up magician added to the entertainment for the evening.

Saturday has 2 lectures for all, an update on CQC regulatory and compliance with CQC expert Tony Carlin; followed by how to fight back against vexatious complaints by Chris Dexter from Weightmans solicitors (NHS resolutions), before we then split up for several different workshops for the rest of the day.

Workshops this year include Varicose Veins: treatments in the community; two hand workshops in practicing injections and dealing with lumps/bumps/and ganglions.

Our ever-popular hands-on sessions include 2 skin surgery sessions with Miles Scholer and Anton Potgieter, plus a basic suturing for beginners' session with Soon Lim. Meantime, POCUS GP return, with their ultrasound kit from GE for everyone to have a play with, whilst giving more details on their courses.

We have more managerial sessions this year than previous, with workshops on the pitfalls of setting up a Private (cosmetic) Clinic with Suhil Alam; and an ongoing Q+A sessions covering everything CQC, ICB's and contracts, expanding on the themes from the mornings session with Tony Carlin and an experienced practice manager (TBA).

These sessions would be perfect for your Practice Manager, not to mention all your other admin team members, so make sure they know they can come along too, at heavily discounted costs of course!

The Vasectomy workshops, include Audit with Gareth James, as usual, along with updates on papers near to being published and details of ambitious funded study into the formation of a Pre/Post Vasectomy Acceptability, Hesitancy, and Anxiety Screening Tool.

Michel Labreque meantime will run 2 further workshops, the first will induce some debate as it focusing on whether we can stop fresh testing...

Michel's second presentation is more aimed at Vasectomy trainers and would be trainers, as he's debuting his new vasectomy teaching model – **Vasecto-Pro.** There may be time for any vasectomy virgin to have a go as well.

As you'll see from the attached flyer, this looks a fabulous bit of kit, and will be a real boon to those offering Vasectomy training. You can buy one before the day and Michel will bring it over with him from Canada, saving all sorts of shipping/postage issues/costs! Please email Paula if you're interested in buying a model before Michel fly over, otherwise bring your cheque book on the day.

As you can see, we've cramped full the 2 days, so come on, if you haven't bought them yet, time to get your tickets!

ASPC AUDIT SUBMISSIONS FOR THE 2024 CONFERENCE

You should have had an email recently relating to how to submit your ASPC audits for Vasectomy, Carpal Tunnel and skin surgery for presentation at the 2024 ASPC Annual Conference on 10th/11th May at Sedgebrook Hall, Northamptonshire

Deadline for submission of audits will be Midnight on SUNDAY 5th May 2024

Any submission after this will need to be added to next year's audit.

That leaves us just 4 days to collate, compile and transpose your answers into a presentable form for the ASPC 2024 Conference.

Therefore, there will be no time for us to contact you to correct any inconsistencies that we may come across in your audit submission, and thus the audit sheets will be printed with these inconsistencies present.

We will though attempt to identify and correct any inconsistencies in the months following the conference, with an up-to-date version of the Audit return sheet placed on the website.

Both the Vasectomy and the Carpal Tunnel Decompression audits have a second part of questions, relating to Operative, Technical and Organisational elements of your service.

Should you not be collecting and submitting your own audit then PLEASE can every individual surgeon undertake these questionnaires, as they help us greatly.

Remember the Carpel Tunnel Decompression and Skin audits are both worth 2 CPD points, whilst the Vasectomy audit (as its more complex) is worth 3 CPD points.

Not only is it a vital part of any Appraisal, your ICB will be badgering you for your audit figures.

NEW VASECTOMY QUESTIONNAIRES FOR THE 2024-2025 AUDIT CYCLE

Hopefully you have already started using the new Vasectomy questions, as the NEW audit cycle started 1st April 2024, and runs for 12 months.

These results will be collated by April 2026, for presentation at the 2026 ASPC Conference.

These new Vasectomy Questionnaires can be found in our member's only area of the ASPC website: https://www.ASPC-uk.net

Log in to the ASPC, go to member's area and then into the folder called **Audits 2024**Here you will find the 'ASPC Vasectomy OPERATION DAY Questionnaire 2024-25' and the 'ASPC Vasectomy POST OPERATION Questionnaire 2024-25'

No questions have been added/changed or retired from last years, though both questionnaires this year only come in one version (which includes multiple doctors and locations) so you will need to delete questions that are not related to your practice when you personalise them.

More details in the questionnaire documents themselves, with 'how to guides', and 'how to YouTube videos' all found in the members area.

Collection of results

There are now three ways you can get on-line collection versions of these 2 questionnaires.

Please the password used to access this account and its linked email address will change in the next few weeks, and you will only find the new passwords in the MEMBERS tab on the ASPC website in the folder: SurveyMonkey and Microsoft Forms Details

B. Your own SurveyMonkey account If you have your own SurveyMonkey account please contact us on admin@aspc-uk.net and we will transfer the 2 questionnaires into your 'Not Filed' folder for you to personalise and use.

2. MICROSOFT FORMS

New for 2024 will be the use of a Microsoft forms account for send and collect your responses

There are guides how to create and set up your Microsoft forms, including step by step video, in a document called 'Microsoft questionnaire templates and Hints Document', which is found in the MEMBERS tab on the ASPC website in the folder: SurveyMonkey and Microsoft Forms Details

VTS STUDY DAY

Just before Easter the ASPC ran its first study session for GP trainees, and it was a huge success with over 210 Coventry and Warwick VTS GP trainees attending the half day online session.

It was an extensive programme and we managed to cover a wide range of topics, including the benefits of diversifying as a GP, with a particular focus on the world of primary care surgery. Our presenters discussed the basics of vasectomy and carpal tunnel decompression surgery, the information a GP should impart to the patient, and the referral process to these services, and their role in follow-up.

We also covered the importance of dermoscopy in helping diagnose skin lesions, and the types of skin surgery available in the community.

In closing the session, we highlighted the numerous benefits of joining the ASPC and the exciting conference programme for this year

The feedback has been excellent, and we hope that this will help to encourage a new generation of GP surgeons. We hope to see a lot of these enthusiastic young clinicians at the conference and get to know them properly.
