





# Travel Details



## By Road:

### **From Junction 15, the M40 North**

- ~ Leave the M40 at junction 15 and take the fourth exit signed for A429 Cirencester
- ~ Travel for nine miles following the signs for Wellesbourne and turning left towards Stow, still on the A429
- ~ At the next island turn left onto the A422 signed for Banbury and Ettington
- ~ Continue through Ettington Village and you will find Ettington Chase on the right
- ~ Ettington Chase is just 10 miles and 15 minutes from junction 15

**Parking at Ettington Chase, Stratford-upon-Avon**  
Parking is extensive and free for guests of the hotel, conference venue and leisure club.

### **From Junction 11, the M40 South**

- ~ Leave the M40 at junction 11 and take the first exit signed for Banbury and the A422
- ~ Continue on the A422 following the signs for Drayton, Wroxton and Stratford-upon-Avon
- ~ When you reach Ettington Village, you'll find Ettington Chase on the left
- ~ Ettington Chase is just 15 miles and 25 minutes from junction 11

### **From Junction 17 of the M1 South East**

- ~ Leave the M1 at junction 17 for the M45 which continues into the A45 dual carriageway towards Coventry
- ~ At the second roundabout, turn left along the B4455 (Fosse Way) towards Cirencester, passing through Stretton-on-Dunsmore
- ~ Continue along the B4455 until the junction with the A422, taking the right turn signed Stratford and Ettington
- ~ Ettington Chase is directly on your left, approximately 20 miles away and 30 minutes' drive from the M45

# Travel Details



## **By Rail- Taxi from Stratford Station is less than £20**

### **Nearest station: Stratford-upon-Avon station**

- ~ This station is 7 miles away and has some direct links and connections from Leamington and Birmingham
- ~ The best mainline station is Warwick Parkway with regular connections to Birmingham or London Marylebone
- ~ Ettington Chase is then 12 miles or 20 minutes from Warwick Parkway station

## **By Air- Taxi from the airport is about £40**

### **Nearest airport: Birmingham International airport**

Ettington Chase is a 30 minute drive from the airport

Follow the signs for the motorway and take the M42/M40 towards Solihull, Warwick and London

The M42 joins the M40 and you should leave the M40 at junction 15

From here follow the directions as from the M40 north




## Mr. Richard Spooner

I settled as a Consultant at the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital in 2000 and have enjoyed developing the anaesthetic curriculum for the new UEA Medical School, being Clinical lead for Day Surgery and establishing a comprehensive pre-operative assessment service. My regular anaesthetic duties include major urology surgery, community dental anaesthesia for patients with learning difficulties and gynaecology together with emergency work in all specialties. I have been a council member of the British Association of Day Surgery since 2005 and chair of publications 2009-2013, editing 12 booklets on topics of relevance to day surgery practice. I am president-elect and will take on the role of President in June 2014.

## Prof. Michel Labrecque



Dr. Michel Labrecque is a full-professor from the Department of Family and Emergency Medicine at Laval University, Quebec City, Canada. He has performed over 22 000 NSV (no scalpel vasectomy) since 1992 and about 1000 in his career. He was the first NSV practitioner in Canada. He has taught NSV to over 40 clinicians nationally and internationally, has been invited to speak at many international conferences, and wrote extensively on the topic. He also worked as a consultant for two international NGOs (FHI 360 and EngenderHealth) promoting safe family planning practices in developing world.

## Dr. David Buckley



He has Occupational Health qualifications and experience, as well as the Cardiff University Expert Witness Certificate, providing medico-legal reports for claimants and defendants.



## **Co-opted Council Member** – Dr. Gareth James

Dr. Gareth James is a full-time lead GP in Daventry. He has undertaken over 1,700 vasectomies during the last twelve years (8 years using the No-Scalpel technique) with only one known failure. He has been the Lead on Audit for BANSV's and now ASPC for the last five years. He was instrumental in setting up standardised questionnaires for patients following their vasectomies allowing a wealth of data to be collected, and is re-launching online versions for easier audit collection. ## **Co-opted Council Member** – Dr. Soon Lim

Dr. Soon Lim carries out skin surgery and vasectomies in the community and is director of the RCGP minor surgery update and assessment programme for the Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire, East Anglia, Thames Valley and central Educational Events department of the college. He also writes medicolegal reports and advises legal chambers on the issue of competence in GP minor surgery.
